

We offer excellent career prospects for anyone who has armed forces experience. Whether you've already left, are thinking of leaving, or due to leave soon, our ex-military recruitment programme is for you.

Our ex-military recruitment programme provides a supportive route into a civilian career. We appreciate the skills and expertise you can bring, and will work with you to make sure you can make an immediate contribution to our essential work, delivering the Road Investment Strategy (RIS). A supportive buddy

We find the buddy system works really well, particularly if your buddy is also ex-military. So you'll be paired up with a buddy when you join. Having been through a similar experience,

they understand the transition, and can provide additional support and guidance, alongside your line manager.

Useful qualifications for project management roles. If you are thinking of applying for project management roles, it would be beneficial to have a high-level overview of project management.

Register

Set up an account, making sure you tick the box which asks if you are ex-military, so we can make sure you receive the additional support from our ex-military recruitment programme.

We suggest you register for job alerts too, so that you can stay up-to-date with the latest jobs matching your criteria.

Top tips for your CV

- Tailor it towards the role you're applying for.
- Include a short personal statement at the top and emphasise relevant aspects of your career history.
- Highlight both practical and transferable skills.
- Be honest.
- Keep it short and sweet and well presented.

Top tips for interviews

- Prepare questions and answers, and practice.
- Tell us why you want to work for us - illustrate that you have researched Highways England and mention specific projects/schemes.

- Our values and behaviours are embedded in our everyday processes. You will be expected to live our values so aim to demonstrate how you meet these behaviours.

- We value what you've been doing during your time in the armed forces, but aim to translate military terminology into terms the interviewer may understand more easily.

For example, if you were a Lieutenant in the Royal Navy, explain that this means that you managed a team of up to 120 personnel.

- Depending on the role you apply for, we may require you to demonstrate your technical skills. If so, ensure that you showcase your technical abilities as well as your transferable skills.
- Research the interview panel.
